Online Statewide Scholars Retreat

On April 18, 2020, MAHEC held its first Online Statewide Scholars Retreat. The three-hour session hosted approximately 70 AHEC Scholars and Missouri AHEC staff. The virtual event was planned as an alternative to an in-person retreat that had been scheduled in Columbia, Missouri. The keynote speaker was Dr. Nauman Ashraf who educated the group on Opioid Use Disorder. The second hour was filled with a virtual social determinants of health activity. The third hour included a panel discussion on the importance of advocacy. A student who participated made this comment: *"The materials presented are so pertinent, multifaceted and current. They are relevant to everybody no matter the future you plan."*
